Dr. Keith is the Chief Executive Officer of the Greenleaf Centre for Servant Leadership (Asia) and President Emeritus of the Greenleaf Center in the United States. Dr. Keith earned a BA from Harvard University, M.A. from Oxford University, Certificate in Japanese from Waseda University, a J.D. from the University of Hawaii, and an Ed.D. from the University of Southern California. He is a Rhodes Scholar.

During his career in the United States, Dr. Keith was an attorney, a state government official, high tech park developer, YMCA executive, and university president. He has given more than a thousand conference papers and presentations in the United States and eight countries in Europe and Asia. He has been featured on the front page of *The New York Times* and in *People* magazine, *The Washington Post*, *The San Francisco Chronicle*, and *Family Circle*. He has been quoted in *The Wall Street Journal* and *Inc.com*. He has appeared on dozens of TV shows and more than 100 radio programs in the United States, the United Kingdom, Japan, Korea, and Australia.
